



ANN ARNOLD SCHOLARSHIP

In a 50-year professional career, Ann Arnold was a groundbreaking Texas journalist, first female press secretary to a Texas governor, and the longtime president of the Texas Association of Broadcasters.

She passed away September 1, 2012.

This scholarship awards \$5,000 to a junior or senior student, or a graduate student, enrolled in a fully accredited program of instruction in broadcast journalism at a four-year college or university in Texas, and who is in financial need.

The complete application must reach TBEF (at the TAB offices) no later than  April 15, 2014.

Applicants must meet the following criteria:

1. Enrollment as a full-time student (minimum of 12 hours undergraduate, 6 hours graduate) either:
 - a) attending classes at the in-state campus or
 - b) participating in a semester-long news internship at an FCC-licensed broadcast station for which academic credit is earned
2. A grade point average of 3.0 on a 4 point scale or equivalent
3. Certification by the college dean or department head that the applicant has a reasonable chance of successfully completing the course of instruction
4. If applicable, written confirmation by the chief news executive of the station providing the internship
5. Completion of a career essay (not to exceed three pages, double-spaced) on either of the following topics:
 - a. Explain the role of investigative journalism in American society in the past 20 years and, using specific examples, how this type of journalism has held government accountable to the citizenry and fostered changes in public policy and spending.
 - b. Explain how journalism can affect a local community and its sense of connection with the world at large.

No applicant will be denied on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age or sexual orientation.
