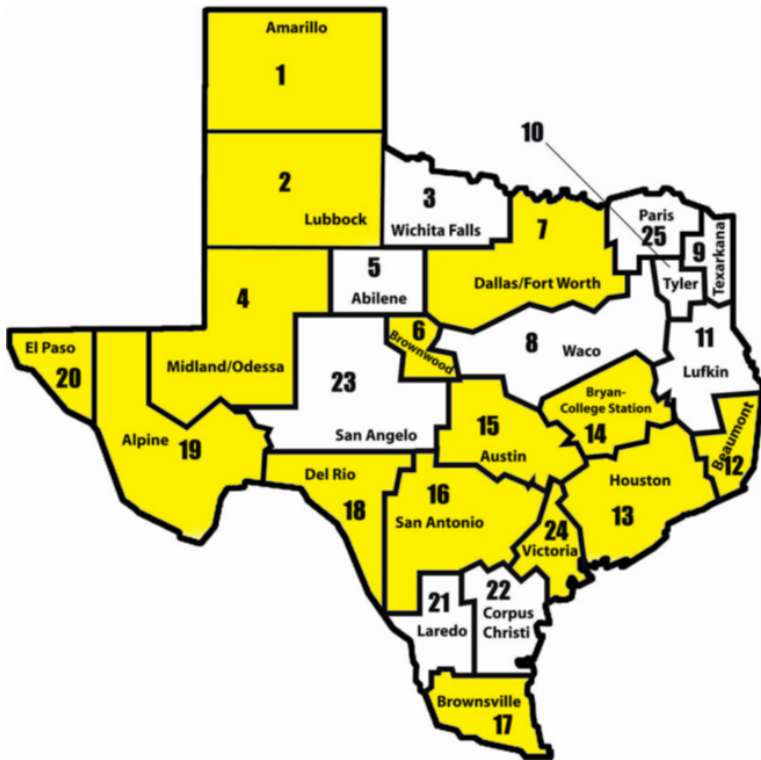


AM Radio Stations are the Backbone of the Texas State Emergency Alert System

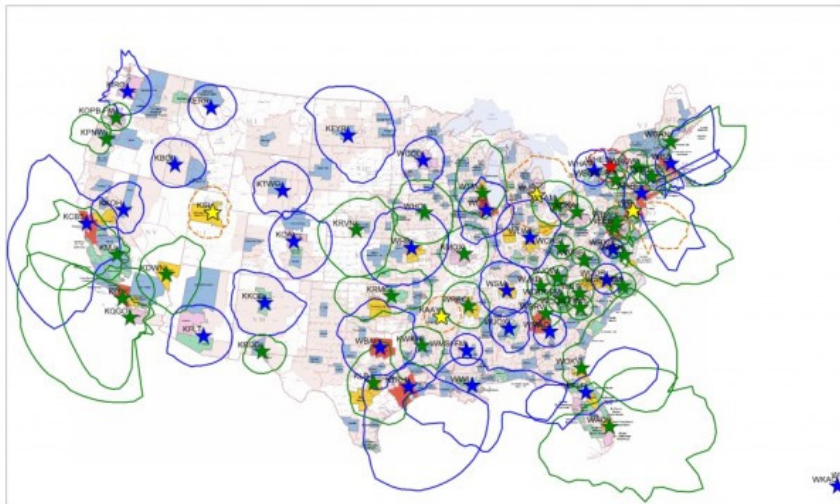

Primary Entry Point EAS Stations

- “Battle-Hardened” facilities represent significant Federal investment in more than 70 radio stations, nationwide
- 90% of these PEP stations are on the AM Band
- These stations serve as the Primary Entry Points for national Emergency Alert System traffic during a national emergency
- They are upgraded to stay on-the-air for 30 days
- FOUR in Texas, ALL are AM: KLBJ Austin, WBAP Dallas-Fort Worth, KROD El Paso, KTRH Houston

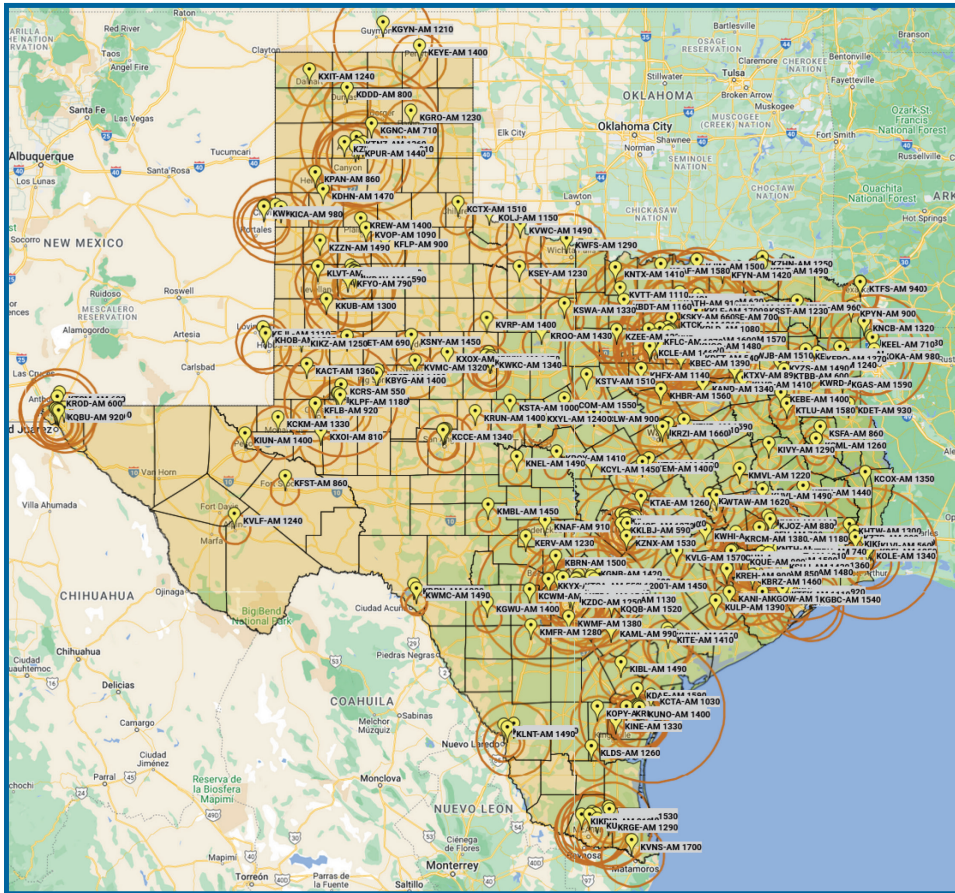
Statewide Radio Audience

Texas DMAs with AM Radio Reach

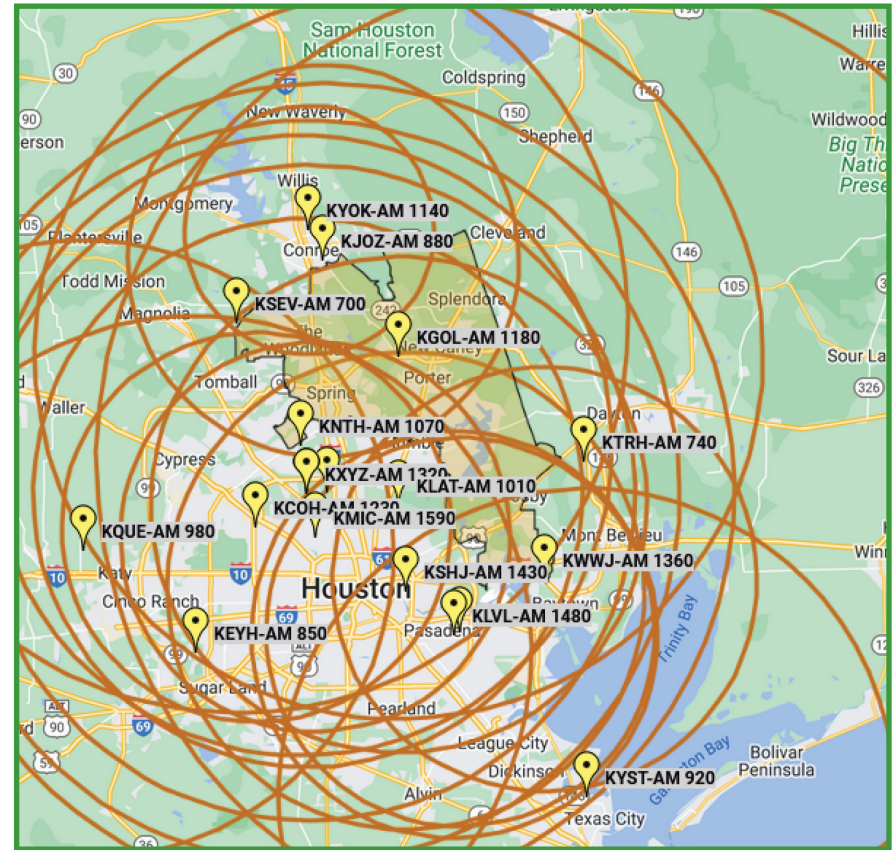
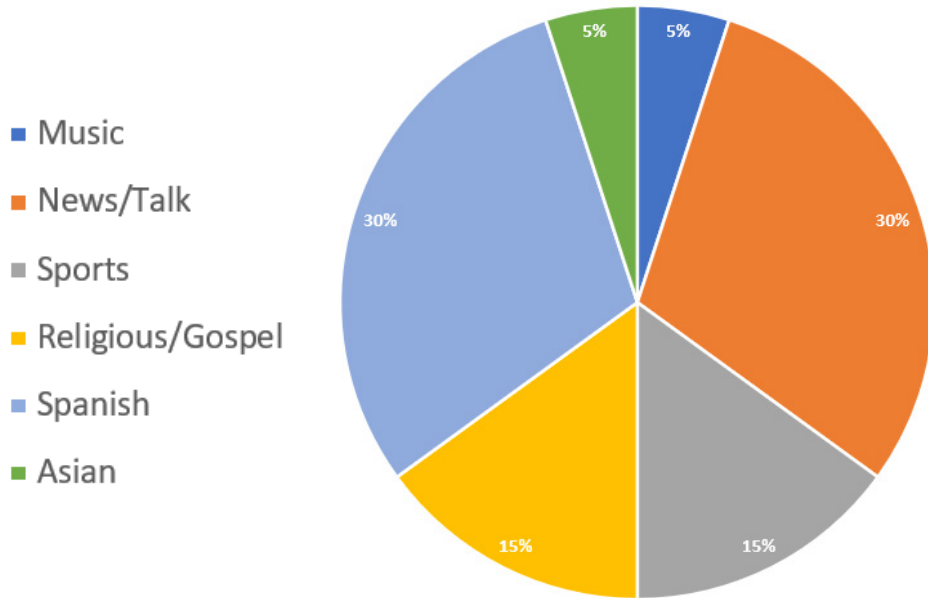

Impact of Removing AM Radio

- Diminishes station's audience reach, revenue and programming
- Compromises community's emergency preparedness and response
- Weakens community ties and local coverage of school sports, news and elections
